As part of this unit the children will:

- Know the features of instructions.

Traditional Tales:

Our text focus for this unit is:

Rama and Sita: The story of Diwali

As part of this unit the children will:

- Discuss traditional tales they know and like.
- Answer reading comprehension questions based on what they read and predict.

Multiplication and Division

As part of this unit the children will be able to:

- Know and recall multiplication facts for 10, 5 and 2 times tables.
- Use these facts to divide by the above numbers.
- Know that x2 is doubling and dividing by 2 is halving.
- Solve problems based on multiplication and division facts.

Measures, Length and Weight

As part of this unit the children will be able to:

- Know units of measurement for length, weight and capacity.
- Estimate heaviest/lightest/longest/shortest.
- Use <, > and = to compare objects and numbers.
- Measure using a ruler then compare using above signs.

- Role play characters in the story and write a recount of a main character.
- Use noun phrases to describe.
- · Record key and new vocabulary they like.
- Retell the story using different sentence types, (statements, exclamations, questions).

As part of this unit the children will:

Letter Writing

Our text focus for this unit is:

The Day the Crayons Quit

As part of this unit the children will:

- Know the purpose and features of informal and formal letters.
- Answer comprehension questions based on what they read.
- Discuss and justify reasons and opinions.
- Write in the role of characters they choose.
- Write response letters formally and informally.

Statistics

As part of this unit the children will be able to:

- Construct pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables.
- Answer questions based on the above representations.
- Write questions of their own based on the above representations.

Fractions

As part of this unit the children will be able to:

- Recognise $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, 1/3, 3/4., 2/3.
- Find the above fractions of shapes, number and quantity.
- Find the above fractions of numbers to 100.
- Compare fractions of amounts using <, >, =.
- Solve problems based on fractions including being able to say what is left.

- Recognise £(pound) and p(pence).
- Compare real life coins using <, >, =
- Compare amounts using <, >, =.
