PE AND SPORT PREMIUM REVIEW 2016/17

What is Primary Physical Education and Sports Premium Funding?

For the past few years the government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum, in order to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. The money goes directly to Primary Headteachers, with each school receiving £8000 plus an extra £5 per child from Year 1-6. The PE and Sport Premium Funding has been allocated by the Government until 2020.

DFE vision for this funding:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Through the use of this funding, it is expected that schools will see an improvement against 5 key indicators as follows:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting healthy lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

How this is implemented at Three Lane Ends Academy

At Three Lane Ends Academy, we are committed to the provision of a balanced program of PE for all children. We ensure the opportunities offered to all the children in their time at our school give them the chance to develop their sportsmanship as well as develop their fitness levels. We also aim to provide a broad range of activities to hopefully enable all children to identify some kind of physical activity they enjoy so they are likely to want to continue with this beyond the school day and after leaving our school.

Whenever possible we incorporate some kind of competitive element into PE lessons so that children learn about winning and losing and how to deal with the emotions this may evoke. We also encourage children to develop the resilience and tenacity that is required to succeed in PE and sports – these are also skills that children need to succeed in the wider school curriculum so this work does impact on wider school improvement.

The school always takes part in any inter-school sports events organised by the high school. We have had some success in winning some tournaments – indicating that the investment in sport and PE is having an impact!

In recent years, a significant investment has been made in the professional development of staff around the teaching of PE and sport in order to develop their confidence and expertise. This has been largely through our links with the local high school where PE specialist teachers have worked alongside all class teachers to plan and teach PE. The expectation is that Three Lane Ends Academy staff will observe and develop their skills and knowledge then take over the teaching with greater confidence and competence.

This has been a very successful initiative and there are now more staff within the school willing and able to teach good quality PE. We will continue with this approach as we expand in order to ensure new staff joining our organisation are given the same opportunities for CPD and the children receive high quality and consistent provision.

Our Mission

We believe that all children, regardless of their athletic talent, physical and mental abilities or disabilities should have the opportunity to take part in all PE lessons. We want all of the PE provision to be high quality, challenging and appropriate enabling all children to achieve their physical potential. We aim to achieve this by constantly investing in the professional development of the teaching staff who teach PE. We intend all our PE provision to be inclusive and engaging. We want our PE curriculum to be inspiring and to broaden children's horizons about what is available for them and what they can achieve. We want PE to demonstrate to all our children that you can enjoy physical activity for the sake of it as well as striving to be the best. We use our sports premium funding to help us to achieve this mission.

How much funding is available?

During the 2016 to 2017 academic year, TLEA will receive £9,550. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

At TLEA our aim is to use the Sports Premium Funding to improve the teaching of physical education and to provide a wide range of opportunities for children to be active and develop a lifelong love of physical activity. We also aim to use the funding in a sustainable manner so that it continues to benefit children at TLEA in years to come and therefore has a lasting legacy.

How will the Sports Premium Funding be used?

TLEA objectives are to:

- Identify our strengths and areas for development regarding PE provision;
- Provide teachers with mentoring and coaching sessions;
- Continue to improve and develop staff expertise, confidence and skills;
- Develop resources and equipment to be used at lunch, play and within lessons;

- Improve the use and creation of Long-, Medium- and Short-term planning to provide a broader curriculum accessing more and more alternative sports whilst also learning new skills;
- Work with Castleford Academy to provide competitive opportunities;
- Provide additional competitive environments built within lessons;
- Provide additional activities such as outdoor and adventure activities;
- Provide opportunities for children to attend and participate in sporting festivals, tournaments beyond the classroom;
- Release teachers from lessons to support sport: competitions, events, planning, reflections;
- Promote and instil a lifelong love of physical activity.

How will we measure the impact?

During the academic year we will continue to monitor the progress of all pupils through teacher assessments each term, and lesson observations. This will inform future decisions about PE and sport provision at TLEA.

Sports provision which support these outcomes:

Lunch time and after school clubs enhance pupil enjoyment of sport have been building interest in physical activity across the year.

This includes an additional £ 180 for Provision lunch time clubs (see PPG funding)

Coaching through sport is also accessed within school, a group of 6 boys (PPG) have Provision boxing coaching regarding self-confidence and self-esteem. The impact is growing their ability to make good choices. This is also funded via PPG grant.

Participation in sport falls into the categories of :

Inter sport :Pyramid sports competitions and tournaments run by CMAT, this culminates in a celebration event for children to enjoy interacting with role models from Castleford Tigers and other regional and National sports heroes and thus raising aspirations in life in addition to participation in sport .

CMAT have a specialist PE SLE deployed regionally to monitor sport premium and increased participation.

Intra sport: the school holds a sports day each year which is well supported and competitive. The children currently compete as teams but we have ambitions to use our school values to create houses such as team 'Respect.' Children will compete in sports and arts events in those teams.

The school has held a British culture and Dance day recently which enabled children to experience traditional dances from the different countries within the UK. It also represents the range of opportunities to participate offered to our children, the event cost £360 and is an additional cost to the Sports premium spend. A curriculum enrichment event which was a memorable experience for all.

Wider participation: In the area there is a strong tradition of joining sports clubs , both as a result of enjoying a taster activity , club or tournaments at the school and as a result of strong local traditions . The school celebrates these opportunities and has showcased children reaching local, area and national finals .

A next step will be a notice board and role of honour for both in school and out of school achievements to share with the whole school community our pride in their achievements .
